



## **OVERVIEW**

The LARK is a community-powered inspiration that encapsulates the sights, sounds and spirit of Bozeman. Serving as a hub for the rich culture, community, and sense of adventure that downtown provides, The LARK has it all. Originally built in the 1960s, its Streamline-era architecture was modernized in 2015 to include a refreshing open-air design, an outdoor fire pit and spacious balconies. In 2018, The LARK expanded to include additional guestrooms and a café space on the ground floor of a second building on the hotel property. Inviting outdoor spaces surround The LARK, offering comfortable gathering places to enjoy a refreshment and take in the Main Street vibe, including everything lively downtown Bozeman has to offer. The LARK is where Bozeman begins.

## **ACCOMMODATIONS**

- The LARK features 67 guestrooms that help to capture the beauty of Bozeman's great outdoors. Decorated with work by local artists and craftsmen, guests can immerse themselves in the innovative and imaginative culture of Bozeman's art community. The LARK's guestrooms come complete with a 32-inch HD TV with Google Chromecast, free WiFi, MALIN+GOETZ amenities, cozy bathrobes, and a signature three-piece bathroom with walk-in tile shower.
- Five room types, ranging from the Grand Avenue King with private deck and king-sized bed to the Queen + Bunk with twin-size bunk beds, suit the needs of a range of travelers. All bunks and beds are plush pillow-tops.
- Upon check-in, all guests will receive a Field Guide travel journal to document their memorable adventures of Bozeman and beyond.
- If you consider yourself a naturally curious explorer, the Map Room will help you find your way. Complete with historical and current maps for viewing, the Map Room puts a modern spin on the vibrant history of downtown Bozeman that will enable the viewer to connect with the old while standing in the new. The LARK provides an enthusiastic crew of people who genuinely care about Bozeman and the possibilities it holds.

## **ART**

The LARK's artful design can be attributed to the combined work of Montana artists that strived to give the rooms a unique, intriguing connection to Bozeman. Wall installations in each room invite guests to explore and be inspired. Whether it be a reference to Montana's highways, a representation of Bozeman's beautiful mountain ranges, or a life-size mural of a full-grown moose, each room is themed to tell a story about the experiences that are waiting just outside the door. Featured artists and contributions include:

- Fine art ceramicist Patrick Hoffman combined the infographic concept with artistry to create a radial map for hotel rooms which grounds visitors with the idea of "you are here," then expands that with a different way to visualize the travel time to various Bozeman area places and activities.



- Graphic Designer Yogesh Simpson sought to pay respect to two outstanding ski areas near The LARK (Bridger Bowl and Big Sky), taking historical data from SNOTEL sites and average daily snow depth totals from Nov. 1 to May 31 in a single year to illustrate the two mountains and the physical differences between them in a hotel room mural.
- Artist Brittany Simmonds created a mural of a moose named “Marvin,” in one hotel room, providing an up-close and personal life-size look at one of Montana's most impressive animals.

### **RECREATION**

In addition to the allures of downtown, The LARK offers convenient access to the lush mountains, valleys and waters of the Gallatin River Valley in its very own backyard. No matter the time of year, there is always fun to be had in Bozeman. To help guests embark on their enthralling adventures, The LARK’s staff blends deep historical knowledge with a love for the area in order to provide an incredible experience. Every employee doubles as a local guide equipped to share the best of the region—from secret swimming holes to powdery peaks. There are multiple award-winning destinations for downhill and Nordic skiing and ice climbing in the winter and hundreds of miles of trails for hikers and cyclists, while teeming rivers and lakes beckon anglers during the summer and fall. Yellowstone National Park is less than 80 miles away.

### **DINING**

On site, guests can enjoy a café space on the ground floor, operated by Treeline Coffee Roasters. The café offers the public and hotel guests espresso, tea, and coffee, as well as light bites for breakfast, such as pastries, and grab-and-go lunch items.
